



Steps Taken With PFAS Treatment

- Carr and Twinney treatment facilities in operation.
- PVWC and Veolia interconnects active
- Carr/Linwood facility upgrade under construction
- Ravine/Marr and Prospect facilities under construction
- Ames facility publically bid, bid opening scheduled for 2/21/24
- E. Ridgewood and West End facilities completed for bid, pending I-Bank authorization to advertise
- Eastside, Main, & Mountain final design and permitting contracts were awarded.
- Operational Strategy in Effect



2024 Steps with PFAS Treatment

- Ravine PFAS Treatment Facility to become fully operational
- Prospect, Ames, Wortendyke construction contracts awarded and construction begins
- E. Ridgewood and West End Facilities to enter bidding and construction contracts awarded
- Cedar Hill, Eastside, Main, and Mountain to enter bidding phase




Next Steps: Lead Service Line (LSL's) Replacements

- Work already underway on utility owned sections (main to curbs)
- □ 326 main to curbs LSL's replaced to date
- Continue verifying materials for unknown service lines
- Attain ordinance approval from all 4 towns
- □ Begin Opt-in/Opt-out phase.
- Work with CDM Smith to complete final design, bid document preparation, and launch Customer Outreach Campaign.



Additional Goals for 2024

- Complete the rehab or replacement of
 1.5 or approximately 7,900 linear feet
 of distribution water main.
- Launch the Emergency/Routine
 Construction Map and Construction
 Activity Page.
- Complete Lab Certification for GC/MS.
- Increase Water Conservation campaign and outreach.



2024 Budget Highlights


- Raftelis Finaincial Consultants, Inc. was commissioned to review and verify the 2024 budget continuing Howard J. Woods Model for
 - Revenue Requirement
 - Expense Calculations
 - Rate Projections
- Raftelis Review Completed on 2/14/24, Summary Memo will be Available on the Website
- Overall Budget increase of 13%

2024 Budget Highlights

- \$3,829,667 of Surplus Accounts to stabilize Rates and Reduce the Need to Plan for New Debt
- Overall Budget increase of 13%
 - 2% Operational Expense Increase \$454,030
 - 11% due to Debt Service and Changes in PAYGO Capital.
 - Debt Service Increase \$970,413
 - PAYGO Capital \$1,106,000
- Expenses Moved to PAYGO
 - Ford F450 Phosphate Truck, F550 Dump Truck, Backhoe Jackhammer
 - Engineering for Transfer Stations between Pressure Zones
 - Engineering to Evaluate Disinfection Needs due to PFAS Centralization
 - Engineering for Next Phase of Distribution Requirements.





- **PFAS Treatment Charges:** To meet the funding demand for filtering PFAS from the drinking water, RW initiated a PFAS Treatment charge in 2021.
 - This charge is in lieu of raising volume rates
 - Able be removed or offset in case of future recovery
 - \$1,013,865 collected in 2023
 - \$1,875,260 to be collected in 2024
- Volume Charges (Variable): Rate based on customer consumption.
 - Based on this year's budget review a 3% rate increase is proposed.
 - Budget review evaluates the three year operation and capital needs
 - Designed to meet minimum surplus for Villages Surplus Policy (Resolution 16-114)
- Service Charge (Fixed): Base Charge applied by meter size



Annual Residential Water Cost Comparison (RW usage based on 7000 gallons per month)




Annual Average Customer Bill of Comparable Utilities Rate Based on January 2024 available data (5/8-inch meter; 7,820 gallons/month)
