



For construction of upgrades and improvements for PFAS treatment to the Ridgewood Water System, the projects are financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB) in the following amounts:

- Prospect PFAS Treatment Facility (Glen Rock, NJ) - \$9,416,000
- Ames PFAS Treatment Facility (Wyckoff, NJ) - \$9,984,890
- Wortendyke PFAS Treatment Facility (Midland Park, NJ) - \$6,315,750
- Cedar Hill PFAS Treatment Facility (Wyckoff, NJ) - \$14,554,000

The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

These projects will improve water quality for the residents and businesses in the Ridgewood Water System (Glen Rock, Midland Park, Ridgewood, and Wyckoff, NJ) by providing centralized PFAS Treatment to comply with the drinking water standards set by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
